- God promised to send Israel into <u>70</u> years of <u>captivity</u> for their unrepentance (Jeremiah 25:1-14).
- God <u>promised</u> to bring Israel out of their <u>captivity</u> after 70 years (Jeremiah 29:10-14).

Background of Ezra

- Ezra & Nehemiah were originally written as one book.
- Ezra-Nehemiah is the <u>sequel</u> to the Chronicles.
- Israelites desire a restoration of the theocratic <u>kingdom</u>:
 - o Need a <u>Davidic</u> King.
 - Need <u>Priesthood</u> (<u>Temple</u>)
 - Need to keep the Mosaic Covenant
- "The good <u>hand</u> of our God is upon us."
 (Ezra 7:6, 9, 28; 8:18, 22, 31)


Lesson 1 – Ezra 1-2:67


- God moves to send a <u>remnant</u> back to Jerusalem to rebuild the <u>temple</u> (1).
 - a. God moves the <u>heart</u> of the Persian king to keep His <u>promise</u> (1-6).
 - b. God moved the <u>heart</u> of the Persian king to give <u>temple</u> articles back (7-11).


a. Some people (2:1-35), the priests (2:36-39), the Levites (2:40), the singers (2:41), the gatekeepers (2:42), the Nethinim (2:43-54), the sons of Solomon's servants (2:55-58), and the unregistered (2:59-63).
