Review of Background

- Occasion: False teachers have promised ritual ways to experience God's presence and blessing (mysticism/legalism).
 Paul's correction in the letter is that those who have trusted in Jesus can already experience the fullness of God's presence through what has been provided already for the believer in Jesus.
- Theme verse: "For in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily; and you are complete in Him, who is the head of all principality and power." (Colossians 2:9-10)

Lesson 2 – Colossians 1:9-14

Walk in the will of the Father by growing in the knowledge of God!

- I. Paul asked for the <u>readers</u> to have knowledge of God's <u>will</u> (9).
- II. Paul requests <u>knowledge</u> for the purpose of walking <u>worthy</u> (10a-14).
 - A. Being <u>fruitful</u> in every good work (10b).
 - B. Increasing in the knowledge of God (10c).
 - C. Being <u>strengthened</u> with all might (11).
 - D. Giving thanks to the Father (12-14).
 - The Father has qualified us to be partakers of the <u>inheritance</u> of the saints in the light (12).
 - ii. The Father has rescued us from the kingdom of darkness (13a).
 - The Father has instated us as citizens of the kingdom of the Son of His love (13b).
 - The Father has redeemed us through the <u>blood</u> of
 Jesus forgiving our sins (14).
