- **Gen 15:5-6** Then He brought him outside and said, "Look now toward heaven, and count the stars if you are able to number them." And He said to him, "So shall your descendants be." ⁶ And he **believed** in the LORD, and He accounted it to him for righteousness.
- John 3:18 "He who believes in Him is not condemned; but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.
- John 3:36 "He who believes in the Son has everlasting life; and he who does not believe the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him."
- **John 5:24** "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears My word and **believes** in Him who sent Me has everlasting life, and shall not come into judgment, but has passed from death into life.
- John 20:31 but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name.
- Acts 4:4 However, many of those who heard the word **believed**; and the number of the men came to be about five thousand.
- Acts 16:30-31 And he brought them out and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" ³¹ So they said, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and you will be saved, you and your household."

In the New Testament alone,

- there are <u>241</u> occurrences of the VERB "believe" in 217 verses. Though not all verses refer to eternal salvation, the vast majority do. (I counted 217 relating to salvation – 90%.)
- there are <u>243</u> occurrences of the NOUN "belief / faith" in 227 verses. I did not make an exact count, but easily 80-90% of those refer to either salvation through "belief" or the content of salvation ("the faith").

Why Calling on the Name of the Lord is for the Saved, not the Unsaved

- Joel 2:32 And it shall come to pass *That* whoever calls on the name of the LORD Shall be saved.
- Acts 2:21 And it shall come to pass *That* whoever calls on the name of the LORD Shall be saved.'

Romans 10:13 For "whoever calls on the name of the LORD shall be saved."

Gen 4:26 And as for Seth, to him also a son was born; and he named him Enosh. Then *men* began to <u>call</u> on the name of the LORD.

10:4 For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes. 10:6 But the righteousness of faith speaks in this way, "Do not say in your heart, 'Who

- will ascend into heaven?" (that is, to bring Christ down from above)
- 10:9-10 that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

- 3:21-22 But now the righteousness of God apart from the law is revealed, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets, ²² even the righteousness of God, through faith in Jesus Christ, to all and on all who believe. ...
