#### **Discussion Questions:**

- 1. - 2. How can you remember that Satan is the enemy not your spouse?

- 4. We often want to know God's will for our lives and decisions. Yet, we often ignore the very things we *know* are God's will for us. We know it's God's will for us to pray "without ceasing," but we don't do it. Discuss some practical ways you can obey God's will in your marriage.
